

HANOVER'S HISTORY


The town of Hanover in York County, Pennsylvania was laid out in 1763 around a hub of five radiating streets which led to towns and cities in southern Pennsylvania and in Maryland (Abbottstown Rd., Baltimore St., Carlisle St., Frederick St., and York St.). This prime location at the prominent center of commerce provided goods and services to scores of travelers.

Railroads brought further economic well-being to the town and its prominence as a trade center increased. Industries anxious to take advantage of this profitable access to outlying markets began to locate along the railroad tracks in Hanover. This economic boom prompted railroad activity and Hanover entered into its golden age period of building construction during the late-nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

As a continued hub of industry, Hanover is the second-largest community in York County, and is continuously growing. With consistent growth and development, many new neighborhoods as well as commercial areas surrounding the downtown continue to be built and expand the Hanover community.


