
The mission of Main Street Hanover is to expand the economic capacity of downtown Hanover, thus improving the business environment, enhancing the quality of place, and increasing community synergy.



Transforming History



Main Street Hanover was honored to receive the Pennsylvania Downtown Center's "Townie Award" this past year for Physical Improvements & Design: Public Space Improvements for the Heart of Hanover Trails.

The Heart of Hanover Trails is Main Street Hanover's downtown walking tour that allows you to walk through Hanover's history. The trails feature Civil War history, human interest stories, and little-known details about life in Hanover.

Main Street Hanover secured tourism dollars from Explore York to renew the historic marker program in the downtown district. In planning for this project, with dedicated volunteers Matthew Jackson, local writer and historian, and Brandon Wingert, with L2 Brands, we were able to not only install 16 locally created and branded historic markers, and four branded Civil War Trails markers, but also provide an updated website and interactive walking tour map and brochure to create a connection with the organization's digital footprint and the tourism assets in downtown Hanover.







Pennsylvania Downtown Center's executive director, Julie Fitzpatrick, said "Each year we look forward to the Townie Awards presentation for its ability to excite and inspire our members to continue their community revitalization efforts. Our member communities work tirelessly to improve their cities and towns, and we love having the opportunity to applaud them for their efforts."

The Townie Awards are a part of PDC's annual statewide conference, which is held in a different commonwealth community each year to highlight the respective city or town's accomplishments in community and neighborhood revitalization. This year's conference, Making Room: Housing for a Vibrant Community, held in downtown Scranton, was attended by close to 300 individuals and included borough and municipal officials, experts in community planning and landscape architecture, and dozens of Main Street and Elm Street managers.

The Downtown Community




Throughout the year, Main Street Hanover hosts several events to engage the Hanover community. These events include free and family-friendly options, such as 2nd Saturdays, held every quarter in collaboration with other local non-profit organizations and small businesses. We also host ticketed events like our popular Sip & Stroll, which brings 500 people into the downtown. Ticket proceeds from these events benefit the Main Street Hanover organization, so we can continue the work and programming we offer to revitalize downtown Hanover for everyone.

This past year, we partnered with Explore York and the destination brand for York County for the 2nd Annual Brewery Olympics, along with Fat Bat Brewing Co., Something Wicked Brewing Co., and Zeichen des Pferdes (now Sign of the Horse Bierhaus). The Brewery Olympics offered a fun day of friendly physical competition through events at each brewery and a relay race for the top scoring teams. The lucky winning team got the opportunity to make their own mark on the craft beer industry in Hanover by creating their own signature beer.
